

You Are God's "Steward"

- Def.: -a person who manages another's property or financial affairs; one who administers anything as the agent of another or others. 2.a person who has charge of the household of another, buying or obtaining food, directing the servants, etc.
- A steward is someone entrusted with something that belongs to another
- We all are entrusted with many blessings, souls under our care and influence, life, material, and spiritual things
 - We are to take care of these things and exercise wisdom
 - We will give account of our stewardship 1 Peter 4:10;
 - We each have something God expects us to take care of and use to improve on what we have – Matt.25:14-30
 - Elders are stewards of God's flock Titus 1:7-9
 - We all are entrusted to use the word of God wisely -2 Cor.5:18-20

We Are Stewards of Relationships

- Homes are an entrusted stewardship
- Physical, Emotional, and Spiritual Wellbeing is at Stake
- Finances are a stewardship
- Financial Irresponsibility is a MAJOR area of conflict and divorce
 - Poor financial stewardship has destroyed many relationships
 - This is a major reason for stress

Financial Problems Cause Stress

- Stress Blurs Objectivity: Need an agreeable plan (budget)
- Stress Drains Happiness
- Financial Problems Can Destroy Unity (if one or both engage irresponsible patterns)
- Poor Stewardship Can Destroy Your Family
- Your Soul Is Your First Stewardship, and covetousness will make you reckless

- Industriousness is part of wise stewardship Consider the ant – Prov.6:6-8
- Establish a Financial Plan Prov.21:5
 - Savings Must Exceed Debts Prov.27:23,24;
 Prov.24:3,4
 - Debts Must Not Exceed Income
 - Must live within income or be industrious to increase the income to meet the needs
 - Covetousness can propel one into more debts -1 Tim.6:10
 - Both parties in marriage must know the agreed plan and work together to keep it working for mutual good
 - Poor stewards destroy themselves and their families
